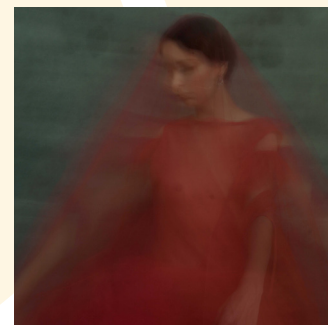

Costa Rica: Long Live Peace & Labor

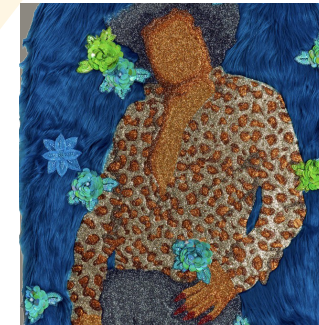

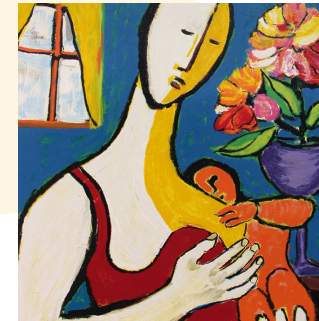
Pop-up: Sacred & Soft Landings: Soñar y Descansar
